The UCLA BRITE Center (Vickie Mays PhD MPH) is interested in getting your thoughts on YouTube videos about smoking cessation in youth.

If interested and aged 14 and older, you will be asked to answer some questions about yourself and your smoking history. You will then get to watch some cool videos about smoking and rate aspects about them. You will be able to complete the survey in 20-25 minutes or less and you can be eligible for the chance to win, if you participate, for the chance to win one of five Amazon gift cards valued at \$250, \$100, \$75, \$50, and \$25. The earlier you participate, the more likely you will be to win the \$250 Amazon gift card.

The \$250 gift card will be raffled off two weeks from the start of the survey.

The remaining prizes will be awarded one per week for the next four weeks. The \$100 gift card will be raffled at the end of the third week, the \$75 gift card at the end of the fourth week, the \$50 gift card at the end of the fifth week, and the \$25 gift card at the end of the sixth week!

CONSENT TO PARTICIPATE IN RESEARCH

Acceptability and Suitability of Smoking Cessation
Videos for Korean Youth

You are asked to participate in a research study conducted by Vickie Mays PhD from the Center for Bridging Research, Innovation, Teaching and Education for Minority Health Disparities Solutions (BRITE) and the Department of Psychology at the University of California, Los Angeles.

You were recruited as a possible participant in this study and your participation in this research study is voluntary.

Why is this study being done?

This study collects information from young individuals who are Korean, who are current or prior cigarette smokers and who are between the ages of 14 to 19. This information will be used to help tailor a quit smoking program (app) for Korean youth that can be accessed through cell phones. Ratings of short videos on smoking cessation that are presented in this study will guide decisions about which (if any) videos should be included in the quit smoking program.

What will happen if I take part in this study?

If you volunteer to participate in this study, the researcher will ask you to do the following: you will be asked to answer some brief questions about yourself and your smoking history. Then you'll be asked to rate aspects of a set of smoking-related videos.

Survey

You will complete a brief demographic survey that asks a few questions about your age, smoking behavior and smoking history. Following this, you will watch four smoking-related videos and for each video will answer brief questions about its content, duration and overall evaluation. This will take about 15 minutes in all.

How long will I be in the research study?

Participation in the study will take a maximum of 15 minutes.

Are there any potential risks or discomforts I can expect by participating?

The potential risks for this study are minimal. The only personally identifying information retained is your IP address, which is retained as long as the study is open to prevent re-enrollments. The file containing IP addresses will be deleted once all subjects are enrolled. All responses to the survey and videos are confidential.

Are there any potential benefits if I participate?

You will not directly benefit from your participation in the research.

Will I receive any payment if I participate in this study?

There are no payments given for your participation. You may choose to enter a raffle for the chance to receive an Amazon gift card valued at \$250, \$100, \$75, \$50, or \$25. For those who participate in week 1 and 2, before (**insert date 2 weeks from when we send the email**), you will be drawn into a raffle pool for the \$250 gift card. The remaining prizes will be awarded one per week for the following four weeks. For those who participate in week 3, you will be drawn into a raffle pool for the \$100 gift card. For those who participate in week 4, you will be drawn into a raffle pool for the \$75 gift card. For those who participate week 5, you will be drawn into a raffle pool for the \$50 gift card, and for those who participate week 6, you will be drawn into a raffle pool for the \$25 gift card.

Participation in the study is not required in order to participate in the raffle. If you were unable to complete the study/did not provide information for the raffle, please contact a Research Assistant at uclabritecenter@g.ucla.edu. Approximate chance of winning will depend on the number of participants.

Will the information about me and my participation be kept confidential?

Information about you is protected by a federal Certificate of Confidentiality. This means that we can't be forced to release information about you for any legal proceeding, even if a court of law asks.

The Certificate allows us to use information about you for purposes of this research, or to disclose it for other research when allowed by law. The Certificate requires other researchers to also protect information we share with them.

There are limits to this protection. The Certificate does not protect your information when:

- You or your family voluntarily release information about yourselves.
- You consent to release of information (for example, the uses described in this form, or if you sign release forms for employment, insurance or medical care).
- A federal agency audits or evaluates research that it funds.

The only information that can identify you is your IP address. This information will not be linked to any responses to the survey or the videos. All responses to the survey or the videos will be coded using a unique code number, not your name. Thus, there is no way to identify you from the data base. Data obtained from this study will however be stored for future use by the PI and/or research team.

Withdrawal of participation by the investigator

The investigator may withdraw you from participating in this research if circumstances arise that warrant doing so such as participating in the survey more than once.

What are my rights if I take part in this study?

- You can choose whether or not you want to be in this study, and you may withdraw your consent and discontinue participation at any time.
- Whatever decision you make, there will be no penalty to you, and no loss of benefits to which you were otherwise entitled.
- You may refuse to answer any questions or skip any videos/parts of videos that you do not want to answer/watch and still remain in the study.
